

The Young American Award

Background:

First presented in 1968, the award is given to young adults who have achieved exceptional excellence in such fields as art, athletics, business, community service, education, government, humanities, literature, music, religion, or science. Who have been involved in service to their community, state, or country that adds to the quality of life and who have maintained an above-average scholastic grade point average. \$1,000 in scholarship money is distributed locally to deserving Young American Award winners.

How to Apply

Applications are sent to the Northeast Georgia Council, which selects those to be honored. A group of community volunteers will select the recipient(s).

Qualifications (all must be met)

- Be a graduating senior (from High School) in 2011.
- Be currently registered with the Northeast Georgia Council in a Troop, Team, Crew, or Post, or as an adult leader.
- Have achieved exceptional excellence in one or more such fields as art, athletics, business, community service, education, government, humanities, literature, music, religion, or science.
- Have been involved in service to their community, state, or country that adds to the quality of life.
- Have maintained an above-average scholastic grade point average. Provide a copy of current school transcript with application.
- Provide at least three (3) letters of recommendation from troop, post, crew, or group leader, individual, teacher, counselor, employer, civic, professional, or community leader, etc. with the application.

Completion of the application with letters of recommendation and current school transcript must be date stamped by the Northeast Georgia Council no later than **Thursday, March 31, 2011**. **Submit to:**
