

General Information Registration

- To register for Webelos Woods, complete the attached application and return it to a Service Center of the Northeast Georgia Council, or mail to the Jefferson Service Center.
- Registration is \$10 per team (a team is a Scout and his adult partner) if payment is received on or before September 14, 2008, \$15 from September 15 - 24 and \$20 thereafter. Registration for Webelos Woods is by Pack and not by individual.
- All Packs, whether they are pre-registered or not, may check in on Friday the 26th no earlier than 4:00 pm and no later than 9:00 pm at the Covered Registration Pavilion (signs will direct). Late registration will also be accepted at this time. Saturday check in time begins at 8:00 am at the administration building.
- The leaders should have a medical form for each Scout, leader, and parent. (The BSA medical form on the back of the Scout application or a Class 1 #34414A medical form is sufficient) You will be asked to present them at registration. You will get them back when your Pack checks out on Sunday along with your patches and certificates.

Program Information

- Any advancement that is completed during the event, is the responsibility of each Leader. This weekend will provide many opportunities for the leaders to sign off on requirements.
- In addition, packs will have an opportunity to earn ribbons based on competitive events. Scoring will include activities participation and Scout spirit.
- Dens/Patrols will be making Patrol Flags as part of the competition



- Flags will be judged on creativity, use of natural materials and identification of the pack, den/patrol and all members of the den/patrol. Flags should show Scout Spirit.

Additional Information

- Packs will be allowed to check out on Sunday after successful campsite inspection. Patches will be issued at check-out.
- One patch per team will be provided with registration. Extra patches can be purchased for \$4 each while the supply lasts.
- The Scoutland gate will be closed from 9:00 am until 5:30 pm during Saturday's activities. No vehicles will be allowed in the campsite area during this time.
- Patrol guides will be assigned to each campsite to help facilitate check in and check out, and assist where needed.
- After the Sunday morning services, all Scouts and Adults will be asked to walk the activity field to help pick up litter. This is Mandatory.

Camping and Parking

- All cars will be parked in the main parking lot. Due to limited parking space carpooling is encouraged. Please see the Check-in and registration guidelines page. **NO RIDERS ARE ALLOWED IN THE BED OF TRUCKS OR TRAILERS. NO BICYCLES.**
- Camping will be by Pack and in an assigned campsite. However, due to the size and participation of this event, it may be necessary to combine packs within a campsite area. Please refrain from roping off your campsite area. Please **DO NOT** bring an axe, hatchet or chain saw to this event.
- Tent camping only (bring your own



tent), no campers or R.V.'s will be allowed in the campsites. Each unit is responsible for their own meals and equipment. Please be sure to bring containers for water.

- Use of stoves and charcoal should follow BSA policies and guidelines. Bring your own **TOILET PAPER AND TRASH BAGS**. Latrines, restrooms, and shower facilities will be available.
- Radios, boom boxes, two-way radios, guns, fireworks, sheath knives, PETS, and alcoholic beverages are not allowed. All BSA and Northeast Georgia Council campground policies must be followed.
- Make sure all campfires are out before retiring for the night and before you check out on Sunday. Webelos dens must meet the requirements for Webelos Den Overnight camping policies found in the Cub Scout Webelos Leader Guide
- Please note any special health needs of your campers on the Registration Form

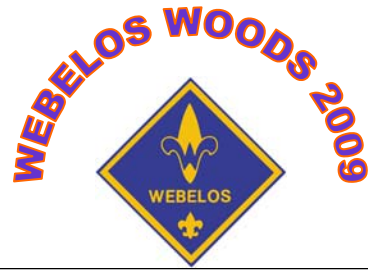

1. Arrive at Scoutland Parking Lot.
2. Send one adult leader to the Registration/check-in area at the Covered Registration Pavilion. (Note: Packs that have Pre-Registered will be given express service.)
3. Combine all Pack equipment & Personal Gear into one vehicle. (All vehicles must be parked in the main Parking Lot) No vehicle will remain in camp.
4. Move one vehicle into your campsite area and unload it, immediately return it to the main parking area. A second load may be taken at this time. (Note: **In accordance with B.S.A. policy, no one will be allowed to ride in the back of an open vehicle, i.e. pickup trucks or trailers.**)
5. Setup campsite (Note: Due to an expected large turnout, more than one Pack may be assigned to a campsite. Please be courteous to your neighbors.)
6. Please follow the direction of all Staff & Traffic Coordinators. This will facilitate your getting checked in and to your campsite.
7. Information packets will be given out Friday and Saturday during check in.
